

Minutes of the Thirty Ninth meeting of the Academic Council held on September 03, 2022

Thirty Ninth Meeting of the Academic Council was convened on September 03, 2022 at 11:30 A.M. in the Board Room, 5th Floor, R.K. Academic and University Block under the Chairmanship of Dr Sudhir Sachdev, President, MGUMST.

List of the members who participated in the meeting is annexed as **Annexure-1**. Dr M.C. Misra, Dr Anil Suri, Dr Nikhil Marwah members of the Academic Council and Dr Hari Gautam and Dr Pragati Kaurani Special Invitees joined the meeting of the Council through video conferencing.

The Chairman at the outset of the meeting welcomed the esteemed members and Special Invitees attending the meeting online and in person. He thanked all the members for attending the meeting.

The Chairman acknowledged and appreciated the contribution made by the members and special invitees in the academic growth of the University. Then after, the agenda items were taken. Discussions and deliberations took place on each agenda item and following decisions were taken -

- 1. Minutes of Thirty Eighth meeting of the Academic Council held on June 03, 2022 were confirmed.
- 2. For passing the grace for the award of Degrees to the students who passed the University examinations and completed their internship (wherever applicable) during the period June 01, 2022 to August 31, 2022 before their conferment on the concerned students at the next Convocation, the Registrar, after seeking permission from the Chairman, requested the Deans of the Faculty of Medicine & Surgery, Dental Sciences, Physiotherapy and Nursing to move to the Council to pass a grace for admission of their students to the said Degrees.

Accordingly, the Deans of the Faculties moved to the Council as under -

After the supplication by the Deans, Faculty of Medicine & Surgery, Dental Sciences, Physiotherapy and Nursing as above, the Chairman requested to the Council – "GRACE BE PASSED" and the Council, assenting the Chairman, said

"THE GRACE IS PASSED"

The Deans, Faculty of Medicine & Surgery, Faculty of Dental Sciences, Faculty of Physiotherapy and Faculty of Nursing then presented to the Chairman the lists of students of their Faculties (**Annexure-2**) to be conferred with respective Degrees.

3. The Council noted and approved the orders of the President regarding admissions in UG/PG programs including M.Phil. Clinical Psychology and Ph.D. for the academic year 2022-23.

It was apprised to the Council by Dr S.K. Meena, Convener, Admission Cell that:

- i) In the following programs provisional admissions have been made through the entrance examination conducted on August 29, 2022.
 - B.Sc., M.Sc. and Post Graduate Certificate Course
- ii) In the following programs, admissions shall be made through entrance examination to be conducted on September 06, 2022. There are many candidates who could not apply for admission in time but are interested in their admission in the MGUMST.

Ph.D., M.Sc. (Medical), MPT, MOT, BPT and BOT

The Council noted the status of admissions to the courses mentioned at i) and ii) above. Regarding ii) above, the Council resolved that in case any candidate (who could not apply in time for admission to any of the courses for which the University shall conduct entrance examination on September 06, 2022) approaches the Admission Cell for admission, the Admission Cell may accept his application and permit him to sit in the entrance examination after determining his eligibility.

The Council also resolved that except for admissions to Ph.D. program, the University should conduct second entrance examination for admission in all such programs where seats remain vacant after the first entrance examination.

The Convener, Admission Cell submitted to the Council that the University has been making admissions through ERP system for the first time. There may be challenges in effective admissions for various reasons. He therefore requested the Council to accept the following proposals –

- i) In case a candidate is unable to pay the fees mentioned in the provisional admission letter through payment link, he may be permitted to deposit this amount through Demand Draft in favour of Mahatma Gandhi University of Medical Sciences and Technology payable at Jaipur.
- ii) In case a candidate has monetary problem and cannot deposit the entire amount at one time, he may be given relaxation in the time limit for depositing the said amount.



The Council considered above proposals of the Convener, Admission Cell and resolved that –

- i) Option to deposit the amount through Demand Draft be accepted but the last date to deposit the amount shall remain the same as mentioned in the provisional admission letter.
- ii) In genuine cases, relaxation in the time limit for depositing the fee mentioned in the provisional letter may be given at the discretion of the Convener, Admission Cell. First installment amount shall be not less than 50% of the total amount. Rest of the amount shall be deposited by the student within one month of his admission.

The Council also resolved that in all such cases, where guidelines for admission are silent/not clear, the President is authorized to take a decision.

- 4. The Council considered and approved the recommendations of the Faculty of Medicine and Surgery made at its meeting held on September 01, 2022.
- 5. The Council considered and approved recommendations of the Faculty of Physiotherapy made at its meeting held on August 20, 2022.
 - It was reported that recently Mahatma Gandhi Physiotherapy College has been awarded five star grading by the Indian Association of Physiotherapists. The Council congratulated the Dean & Principal, MGPC for this achievement.
- 6. The Council considered and noted Advisory related to 1st MBBS examination and promotion to 2nd MBBS issued vide no. NMC/Advisory(MBBS)/2021/ 029415 dated 27.10.2021 by the President, UGMEB, National Medical Commission, New Delhi as under -

As prescribed in the erstwhile Medical Council of India Regulations on Graduate Medical Education, 1997, clause 8 passing in 1st professional is compulsory before proceeding to 2nd MBBS training. It is to inform all the students that unless the students pass successfully in the 1st MBBS examination they will not be promoted to 2nd MBBS.

Moreover, if a candidate has failed to pass in the supplementary examination, he will have to repeat the 1st MBBS course curriculum and appear for the university examination of 1st MBBS with the new batch.

The Council resolved that action be taken by the Principal, MGMCH and the Controller of Examinations as per the aforesaid advisory of the NMC.

- 7. Dr Rajaat Vohra, Director/Coordinator, Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) apprised the Council through power point presentation about the progress made by the IQAC. The Council appreciated the progress made so far by the University in this regard and resolved that the IQAC should make more efforts through respective committees/cells towards encouraging the faculty members of all the colleges/institutes of the University for more research publications in indexed Journals and quality research projects.
- 8. The Council considered request of the Principal, MGDCH dated September 01, 2022 regarding nomenclature of the programs permitted by the Academic Council



vide resolution no. 10, dated June 03, 2022 for their conduction at college level and resolved that the Principal be permitted to conduct the courses at college level with the following nomenclature -

S. No.	Name of the course	MGDCH permitted to conduct the course with the nomenclature
1.	UAPGCC – Oral Implantology	Advance Certificate Course in Oral Implantology
2.	UAPGCC – Preventive Dentistry	Advance Certificate Course in Preventive Dentistry

Items with the permission of Chair

- 9. Dr Hemant Malhotra, Director, Oncology Services, Sri Ram Cancer & Superspeciality Centre and Professor & Head, Dept. of Medical Oncology, Mahatma Gandhi Medical College Hospital submitted that the University has been successfully organizing Clinical Combined Rounds (CCR) every week. The work presented in these CCRs is of good quality and therefore it should lead to publications. The Council appreciated the proposal of Dr Hemant Malhotra and resolved that the work presented in CCRs must be published in indexed Journals. The Council resolved that Dr G.N. Saxena, Pro-President, Dr Swati Garg, Dean & Principal, MGMCH and Dr Munish Kakkar, Coordinator CCR shall workout modalities to implement it.
- 10. Dr Swati Garg, Dean & Principal, MGMCH submitted to the Council that Basic Life Support (BLS) course has been made mandatory by the National Medical Commission for MBBS students. She proposed that each and every student admitted to MBBS course must compulsorily do it. For this course, Rs. 1000/- be charged from each student. Only those students, who successfully complete BLS course should be allowed to appear at final MBBS University examination.

Dr Narendra Padiyar, Dean & Principal, MGDCH also submitted to the Council that the aforesaid BLS course should also be made compulsory for BDS students. He supported the proposal of the Dean & Principal, MGMCH as above.

The Council agreed with the above proposals of both the Deans as above and resolved that each and every student admitted to MBBS and BDS course must compulsorily do BLS course during his MBBS/BDS course duration. Rs. 1000/- be charged from each student. The concerned Principals shall ensure smooth conduction of BLS course at college level and issue certificates to the candidates who successfully complete the BLS course. Only those students, who have successfully completed BLS course should be allowed by the concerned Principals to appear at final MBBS/BDS University examination.

11. Dr Tanjul Saxena, Principal, MGCOHA submitted to the Council that at many places, candidates with MBA (Hospital Management) or MBA (Hospital Administration) are considered eligible for Ph.D. in Hospital Administration. She

requested that MBA (Hospital Management) and MBA (Hospital Administration) qualification of recognized Universities be treated as equivalent to MHA qualification of our University and accordingly the candidates possessing MBA (Hospital Administration) or MBA (Hospital Management) of a recognized University should be considered eligible for admission to Ph.D. in Hospital Administration program, if otherwise eligible.

Further, she submitted that the process of admissions (2022-23) to BHA/MHA started w.e.f. 21.04.2022 with the effective enrolment fee Rs. 11,000/- for BHA and Rs. 22,000/- for MHA program. Accordingly, enrolment fee has been conveyed to the candidates seeking admissions to BHA/MHA program. Later on, University vide office order no. MGUMST/Acad/fees/2022/525 dated 29.06.2022 has revised enrolment fees Rs. 11,500/- for BHA and 24,000/- for MHA course w.e.f. 01.07.2022. She requested the Council to permit MGCOHA to charge the enrolment fee which was effective prior to 29.06.2022 enabling MGCOHA to honour the commitment made to the candidates at the time of offering the admission (2022-23) to BHA/MHA program.

The Council considered and accepted the request of Principal, MGCOHA as above.

- 12. Dr G.N. Saxena, Pro-President and Convener, Ph.D. Committee of the University placed before the Council, the recommendations of the Ph.D. Committee made at its meeting held on August 30, 2022. These recommendations were considered and approved by the Academic Council (**Annexure-3**).
 - While approving the recommendations of the PhD Committee the Council also resolved that tuition fee for PhD program (2022-23 and onward) may be accepted from provisionally admitted candidate in installments. At the time of admission, the selected candidate shall have to deposit one-year tuition fees, caution money and two post-dated cheques of the amount equal to annual tuition fees.
- 13. The Dean, Faculty of Medicine placed before the Academic Council, format of degree to be awarded to MHA qualified students and also the format of certificate to be awarded to various PG fellowship programs (one year duration) qualified students. The Council approved the format presented by the Dean, Faculty of Medicine.

The Meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
